

# Socially useful activities

#### Presentation

This class provides an introduction to the "third sector", which comprises associations, foundations, mutual insurance organizations, cooperatives, and social enterprises. It is intended to enable students to grasp the place and role of these organizations in the realm of private economic and social activities as well as in the fields of public action, not only in quantitative terms but also in terms of their specificities and contributions to all political, social and economic institutions. For this purpose, we will, first of all, broadly examine the sector, before focusing on the qualitative and quantitative analysis of the different types of organizations concerned (associations, foundations, mutual insurance organizations, cooperatives, social enterprises).

### Recommended Prerequisite(s)

Students must have general knowledge of public policies, private organizations, and enterprises; Specialized knowledge, about the law and institutions, for example, is useful but not essential.
