



## Theory of organizations

### Presentation

This class provides an overview of the theory and sociology of organizations through the successive contributions of engineers, psychologists, sociologists, and economists who have gradually enriched the discipline. The class discusses the opposition between the integrative theories of organizations that prevailed until the 1980s and the theories of organizational breakdown (i.e. the theory of the firm).
